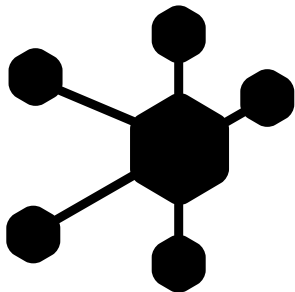

Hepatitis Network for Education and Testing

The Hepatitis Network for Education and Testing is a network of public health partners, community-based organizations, tribal health organizations, people with lived experience, and healthcare providers, focused on identifying and addressing the unmet needs of people who inject drugs (PWID) to improve their access to viral hepatitis education, prevention, testing, linkage to care, and treatment.

Through this 5-year CDC cooperative agreement, NASTAD (National Alliance of State and Territorial AIDS Directors) and their partners National Viral Hepatitis Roundtable (NVHR) and National Association of County and City Health Officials (NACCHO) are focusing on improving the health of PWID.

NETWORK STAKEHOLDERS AND STRUCTURE



NETWORK MEMBERS

Network Members are the individuals and organizations who make up HepNET, with the shared aim of reducing inequities in viral hepatitis care among PWID.



LEARNING COMMUNITIES

Learning Communities are select cohorts of network members who receive intensive technical assistance and capacity-building assistance (TA/CBA) toward a common goal.



LLE CONSULTANTS

Leading with Lived Experience Consultants are individuals trained to provide TA/CBA to the learning communities through the lens of their lived expertise with viral hepatitis and/or drug use.
