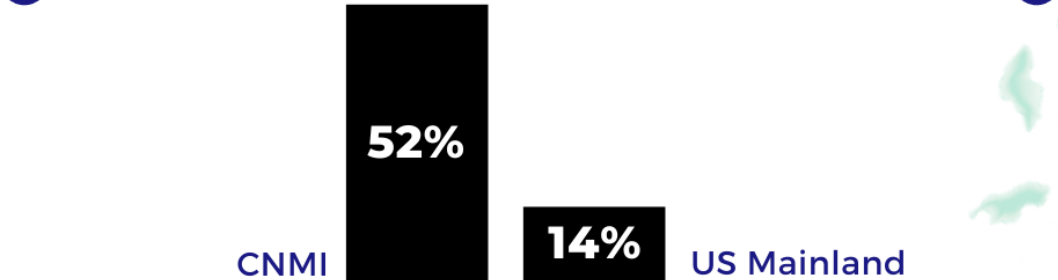


Native Hawaiians & Other Pacific Islanders

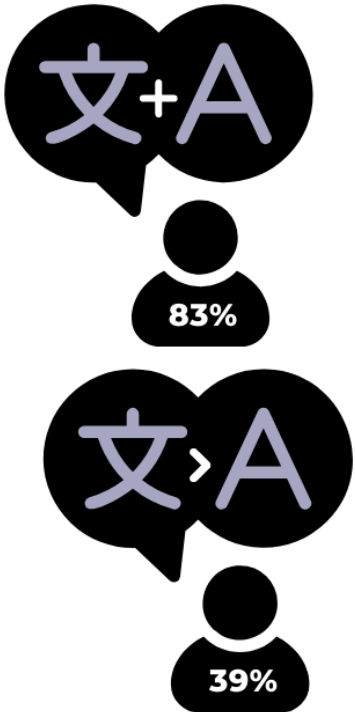

Living under the national poverty line

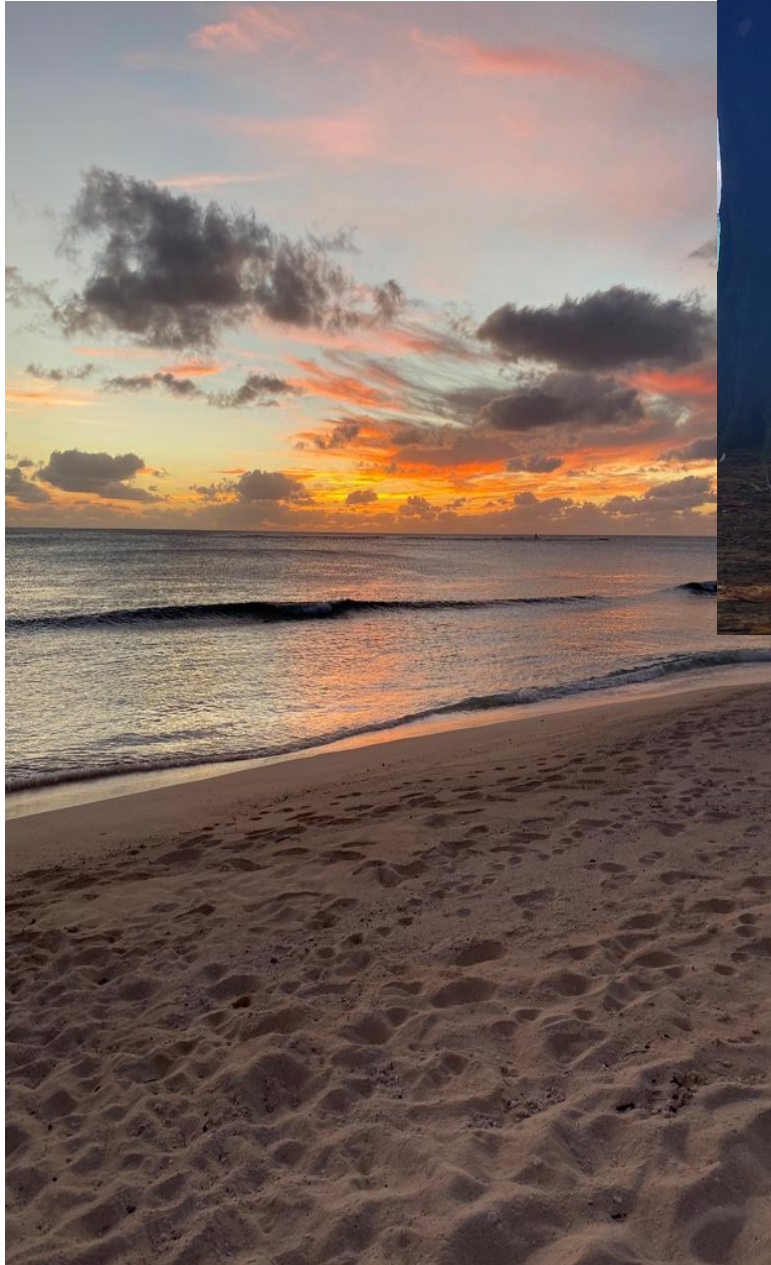

Guam

Guam - Tano I' Man Chamorro (Land of the Chamorros)

- The United States westernmost territory: "Where America's Day Begins."
- Indigenous people: Chamorros (CHamorus), who first settled the island about 3,500 years ago.
- As of April 1, 2020, Guam's population was 153,836, representing a decrease of 3.5% from the 2010 Census population of 159,358.
- Political Status: Organized, unincorporated territory of the United States since 1950. Considered a US colony and was previously a colony of Spain, the US, Japan and then the US again after World War II.
- Economy: Mainly supported by tourism particularly from Japan, Korea and the United States armed forces. The US military is the secondary economic force.
- Official Languages: English and Chamorro
- Land Area: 214 square miles (549 square kilometers) including outlying islands.

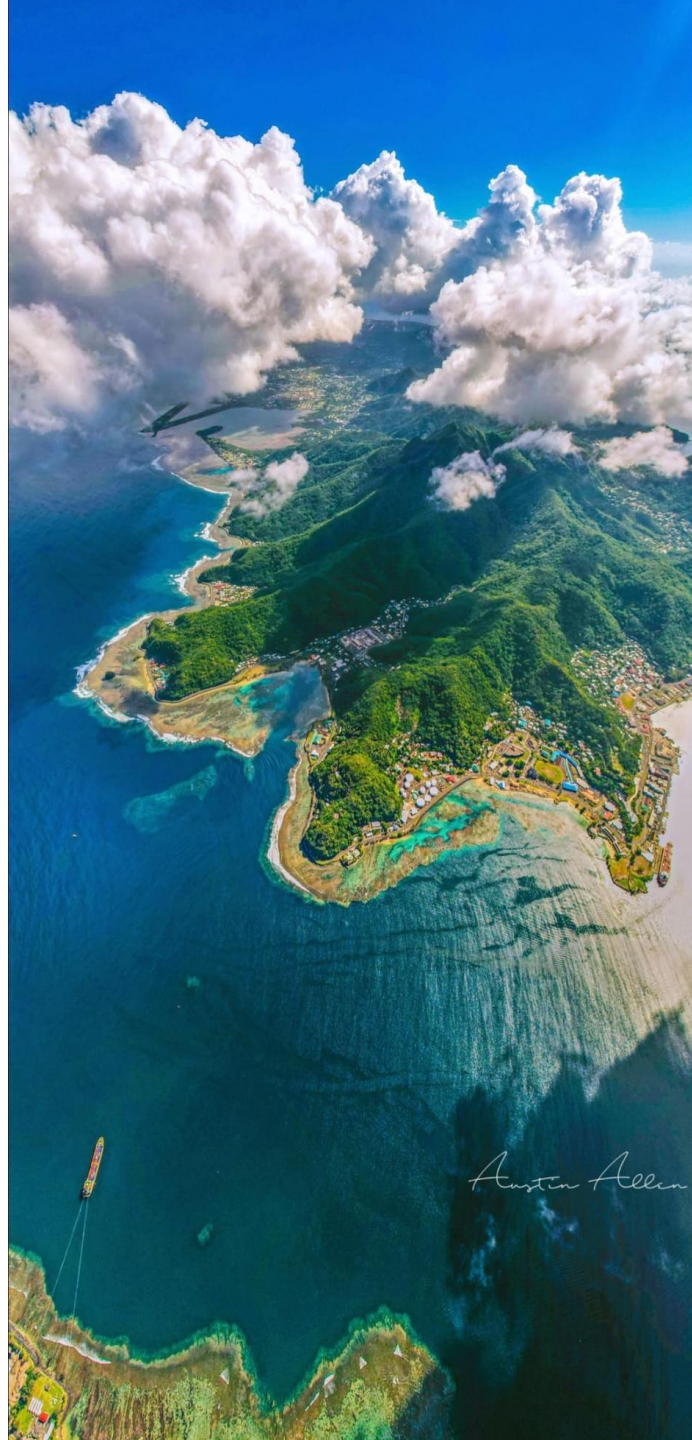
