⁵ Regarding anonymous HIV tests: A person who collects and anonymously *submits* a sample of the person's own body fluid or tissue for HIV testing is not required to report a positive test result. However, the person or laboratory *performing* the test on an anonymous sample shall report a positive HIV infection test result.
