

ANNUAL MEETING Leaning forward in Long-Term Sustainability

- 1. Maximize rebate and program income utilization: as many states and territories strive to consider meaningful ways to expend or obligate funding, NASTAD should be a consideration since membership dues are allowable costs under federal and rebate funding streams.
- 2. Immediate reinvestment back to the states and territories
- **3.** Sustain capacity to develop tools, policy research, education materials, and provide tailored subject-matter expertise to ADAPs in the following implementation focal areas: <u>administrative</u>, <u>operational</u>, and <u>capacity-building</u>
- 4. Unique position to more fully support state/territorial HIV care programs (e.g., Part B grantees) to ensure implementation of state-of-the-art medical and support services commensurate to the portfolio provided to ADAPs
- 5. Expanded capacity for HCA to provide intensive pre-planned technical assistance with expert staff at NASTAD
- 6. Ensuring appropriate funding to support the negotiation efforts of the <u>National ADAP Crisis Task Force</u> as the drug pricing environment becomes more complicated with Pharma
