The self-tests are a fast and private way to test for HIV since they can be used anywhere and at any time. Together TakeMeHome is a collaboration between Emory University, Building Healthy Online Communities, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, NASTAD, OraSure, and Signal. This is a similar but different program from the "Take Me Home" program.
